- Annual 70,000 ED visits
- Admission rate: 36%
- Level 1 Trauma Center
 - -8500 trauma evaluations in 2017
- Regional Burn Center
- Tertiary Care Referral Center

Pre-intervention VUH ED Opioid Prescribing Practices

October 2016-October 2017:


- 4196 opioid prescriptions among discharged patients
- 49,557 opioid tablets
- Average 350 opioid prescriptions/month
- Prescription quantities ranged from 1-10 days

VUH ED Opioid Interventions

- October 2016: Standardized management of ED patients requesting opioid detox assistance
 - Comprehensive listing of treatment options
 - Standard discharge medications
 - Medical Clearance documentation
- Mid-November 2017: (2 weeks after VUMC conversion to Epic) Programmed all opioid prescriptions from the ED to default to #12 tabs/3 days.

Post-Intervention VUH ED Opioid Prescribing Practices


ED Prescription Count Trend

- April 2018: In collaboration with Anesthesia colleagues and CME office, QuizTime pilot, a web based education application, to educate ED clinicians on opioid and pain management
- May 2018: Working with Epic to create ED
 Opioid utilization reports for ED administration
 and outpatient prescriptions at the Department
 and Provider levels.
- Summer/Fall 2018: THA Opioid Light Pilot
